## **1. BASIC INFORMATION.**

### **1.1. Organizer**

The event is public, admission free.

The event does not have a program due to its character (family picnic). The rules of the event and the rules of the event area are set out in Appendix 1 to the Security Plan.

### **1.2. Date and location.**

The event will take place on:

The event will be held on (hours may change): Friday - from 12.00 to 23.00, Saturday - from 12.00 to 23.00, Sunday- from 12.00 to 18:00, and in addition to the sale of food it will also include attractions such as: a background music, a chillout zone, a children's zone, a beer zone.

### **1.3. Protections.**

The organizer provides security for the event by means of:

- general protection throughout the entire festival
- employees of Street Food Norway AS
- technical measures (white - red warning tape)
- Security services as employees Larvik Mikrobryggeri AS in beer zone.

The protection will be made by placing trucks with food and technical means in accordance with the deployment map attached to this study and the deployment of security services. All employees will ensure public order on the premises of the event and the security of its participants.

## **2. EVENT SAFETY GENERIC RISK ASSESSMENT.**

2.1. This plan was created to determine the conditions and rules of the event so as to ensure security and public order in a proper way. It describes in a detailed manner the manner of security, the organization of security services and the rules of cooperation with state public security services.

2.2. The organizer predicts that the number of participants staying at the climax of the event will not exceed 500 people. The risk of an event is considered negligible because of its character (family picnic).

Predicted threats are:

- attempts to violate the personal inviolability of event participants,
- aggression from people under the influence of alcohol, drugs
- hooliganism, robbery, theft,
- fire,
- an emergency medical case,
- virus infection.

Potential sources of fires in the event area:

- the possibility of arson by people staying at the event,
- short circuit of the electrical installation,
- use of open fire and smoking in unmarked places,
- utilization of fire hazardous materials (liquids, flammable and toxic gasses, chemical, explosive and flammable materials),
- non-compliance with fire regulations.

### 3. AIM OF EVENT SECURITY.

The purpose of securing the event is to ensure peace and public order during its duration, to ensure the safety of those present at the event, and to ensure the family-friendly character of the event in accordance with its assumptions.

The task of the employees and bodyguards to achieve this goal is to secure the venue from attempts to disturb public order, prevent hooliganism, aggression from persons under the influence of alcohol and intoxicants, and counteract robberies and theft.

The employees and bodyguards will control the movement of people in this area, do not let people there, which by their behavior cause disorder, and have dangerous tools, alcohol or drugs. They will also participate in the perpetrators' approach, if necessary, help in the effective evacuation of participants of the event and enable the passage of emergency vehicles.

#### 3.1. Security/safety services.

##### Composition of services:

Street Food Norway AS company.

**The Larvik Mikrobryggeri AS** company is responsible for all matters related to selling beer and all unexpected situations related to it throughout the entire festival.

##### The manner of marking the services:

Employees dressed in marked uniforms and reflective vests,

##### Distribution of services:

From 30.07.2026 - 02.08.2026 in the form of patrols carrying out permanent supervision in the area of the organized event during its duration

Tasks employees during festival:

- Employees of Street Food Norway AS of the event are responsible for:
  1. Ensure peace, public order and safety of people present at the event, as well as ensure the family-friendly character of the event in accordance with its assumptions.
  2. Informing people interested in the event (viewers, walkers, nearby inhabitants) about the purpose, course and temporary difficulties associated with the event.
  3. Conducting continuous observation of the event area in order to prevent attempts to disturb public order.
  4. Counteracting attempts by unauthorized parties to enter unauthorized places.
  5. Responding to incidents and threats (give instructions to person disturbing order) and taking necessary actions (including the inclusion of persons posing a threat to promptly transfer them to the Police)
  7. Maintaining constant contact and immediately informing those responsible for the organization about any difficulties and irregularities in the duration of the event.
  8. In case of danger, help in the effective evacuation of participants of the event and take care of the vehicles of emergency services.

- Employees of Larvik Mikrobryggeri AS of the event are responsible for:

Employees selling alcohol at festivals have several important responsibilities aimed at ensuring safe and compliant alcohol sales. Below are general duties that such employees should fulfill:

1. Checking the age of buyers: Employees are obligated to check the identification of purchasers to ensure they are old enough to legally buy alcohol according to local legal regulations.
  2. Understanding alcohol sales regulations: Employees must be well-versed in the regulations governing alcohol sales in their region, including permissible hours for sales.
  3. Refusing sales to minors: Employees are required to refuse alcohol sales to underage individuals or those unable to provide proof of their age.
  4. Refusing sales to intoxicated individuals: If an employee suspects that a buyer is already intoxicated, they should refuse the sale of alcohol, following the principles of responsible selling.
  5. Preventing alcohol abuse: Employees may receive training on identifying situations where customers are abusing alcohol and taking appropriate actions, such as contacting security or medical personnel.
  6. Maintaining order: Employees should act in a manner that ensures order and safety at the alcohol sales location, avoiding potentially hazardous situations.
  7. Cooperating with regulatory authorities: Employees should cooperate with local regulatory and security authorities, providing them with necessary information and adhering to all requirements.
  8. Accuracy in handling payments: In cash transactions, employees should be accurate and honest, avoiding fraud or errors.
- Employees selling alcohol at festivals should also receive proper training to effectively fulfill their duties and operate in accordance with safety principles and legal regulations regarding alcohol sales.

### **3.2. Emergency/rescue protection**

**A permanent stay of the emergency and fire services during the event is not expected.**

Possible intervention from the medical and fire emergency services will take place by means of telephone communication submitted by designated persons, in accordance with prior agreement with the appropriate emergency and fire brigade units.

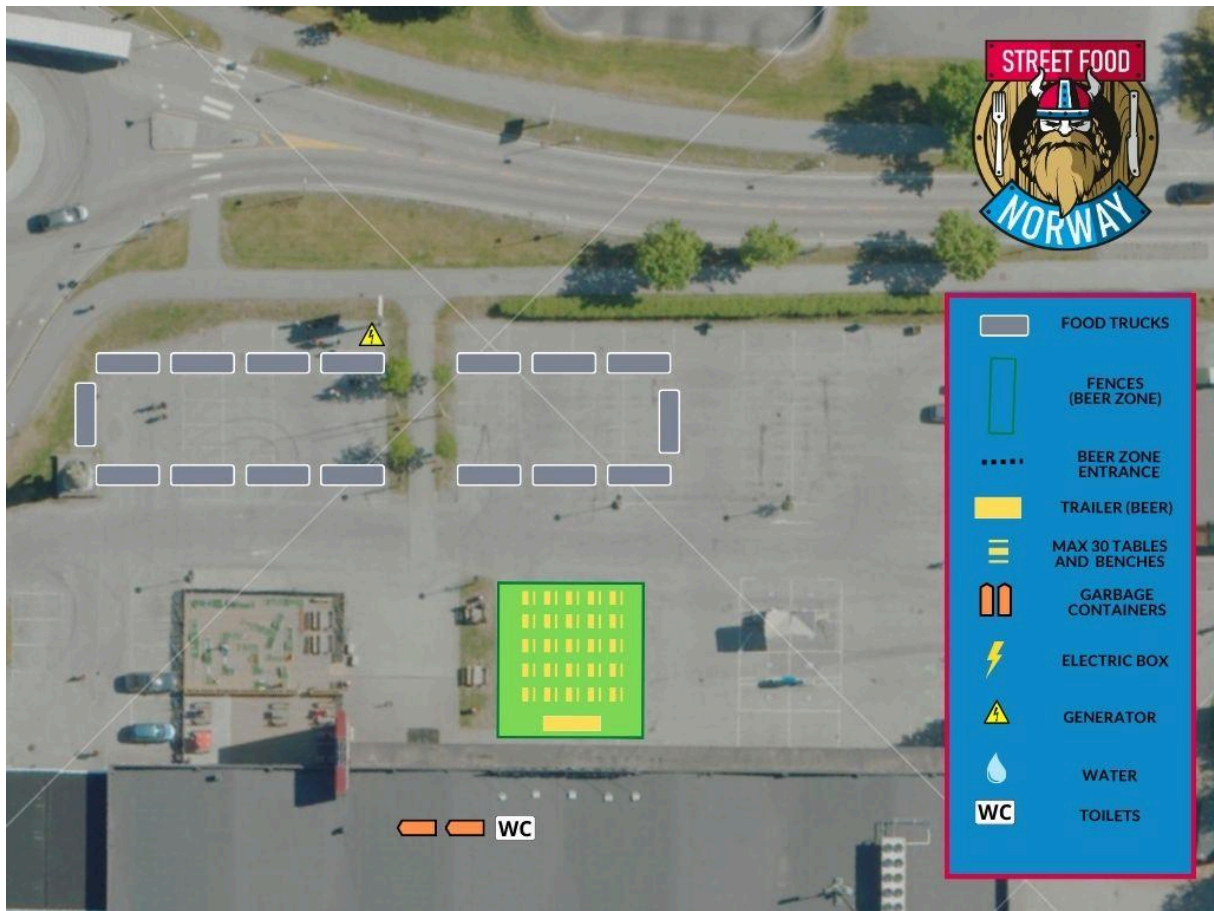

## **RULES OF EVENTS**

### **Event place: Thon Senter Bjørneparken**

**Date:** 30.07.2026 - 02.08.2026

All persons participating in the event and staying on the premises of the event are obliged to behave in a way that does not endanger the safety of other people and to comply with the following provisions of the regulations.

The event organizer is entitled to record the course of the event, in particular the behavior of people using image and sound recording devices.

1. The prohibition on entering the event area concerns:

- persons bringing intoxicants, alcoholic beverages, psychotropic substances, weapons, pyrotechnic or explosive articles, possibly other dangerous objects or tools, as well as persons bringing objects that make identification impossible, eg for balaclavas,
- people behaving aggressively, refusing to present a reliable document or checking luggage or clothing (in case of suspicion, and try to bring the aforementioned measures or objects).

2. The following people will be removed from the event area:

- they behave aggressively, disturb the party or pose a threat to other people,
- despite the prohibition, they have entered or brought the above-mentioned forbidden measures or objects.

3. Persons present on the premises of the event are obliged to follow the organizers' order and order service.

4. In the event of resisting order services, persons will be immediately handed over to the Police.

5. The activities listed above should be carried out in the least possible manner affecting human dignity.

6. Legal guardians, or parents are responsible for minors.

7. Participants of the event acknowledge that the admission to the venue is tantamount to giving permission for free photographing, filming or making other types of recording of the person in connection with the event and broadcasting, distributing or transmitting voice and image in connection with any program presenting the event.

8. If one notice a fire or other danger, persons present at the event should:

- immediately notify the security and safety services,
- avoid panic,
- follow the orders and messages of the security and safety services,
- do not hinder access to emergency services.

9. Participants of the event acknowledge that the primary task of the security service is to counteract and prevent even the slightest threat to the property and participants of the event. Every action taken by security and order services, preventing such phenomena, is permissible provided that it is consistent with the law.

10. Permissions for order and information services:

- to identify persons in order to establish their identity,
- in case of disturbing public order, law enforcement has the right to call them to leave the event,
- recognition for immediate transfer of persons posing a direct threat to human life or health, as well as protected property.

11. Each employee and participant of the event is required to maintain personal hygiene.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROCEDURE  
in the event of a fire or other local emergency  
in place and during the event**

1. If you notice a fire or other danger, please remain calm and notify the security or safety services about the danger.
2. The security or safety services should immediately alert the Fire Brigade - **emergency number 110**
3. Fire Brigade should be informed about:
  - location of a fire or other danger,
  - occurrence of a threat to people's lives.
4. If necessary, a fire or other danger should also be notified:
  - Ambulance - **emergency telephone 113**
  - Police Station - **emergency telephone 112**
5. The person calling the Fire Brigade is obliged to provide his name and the function and telephone number from which the notification is sent.
6. As a result of such a threat, the employees of the security services closest to the fire enter the action in order to perform tasks related to the evacuation of the participants of the event, to control the possible panic and to provide premedical help.
7. The personnel of the security services participating in the rescue operation or at the liquidation of another threat are obliged to:
  - locate the source of the fire,
  - take action to eliminate the threat,
  - in the first place to save the endangered human life, including organization of the evacuation,
  - indicate and secure emergency exits,
  - provide first aid to injured persons,
  - enclose and transfer to the Police persons who violate the law,
  - remove combustible materials, valuable devices from the range of fire or danger area
8. Persons present at the party are obliged to:
  - execution of order of security services and information services messages,
  - not hinder access to emergency vehicles.
9. Persons posing a threat to the life or health of the participants of the event or behaving aggressively will be included and handed over to the Police along with a service note containing data regarding the reason for the incident and personal details of the witnesses of the event.
